

Executive Proclamation
State of South Dakota
Office of the Governor

Whereas, According to the International Diabetes Federation, diabetes now affects more than 300 million people; and,

Whereas, If nothing is done to reverse this epidemic, the Federation predicts that some 450 million people will live with the disease by 2030; and,

Whereas, More than 56,000 South Dakotans over the age of 17 have been diagnosed with diabetes and an additional 18,000 have undiagnosed diabetes; and,

Whereas, Diabetes is the seventh leading cause of the death in South Dakota, accounting for more than 1,100 deaths from 2005-2009; and,

Whereas, South Dakota Urban Indian Health has teamed up with the South Dakota Diabetes Coalition to take part in the World Diabetes Day Monument Challenge; and,

Whereas, The World Diabetes Day Monument Challenge takes place all over the world, lighting popular monuments blue the evening of November 13, 2011, in recognition of World Diabetes Awareness Day; and,

Whereas, South Dakota will have two monuments lit for the Challenge, Falls Park in Sioux Falls and the State Capitol in Pierre; and,

Whereas, It is important for all South Dakotans to be aware of diabetes and their risks for the disease:

Now, Therefore, I, Dennis Daugaard, Governor of the state of South Dakota, do hereby proclaim November 14, 2011, as

DIABETES AWARENESS DAY

in South Dakota.
